INTRODUCTION

As health and social care systems across Europe undergo profound demographic, digital and organisational transformation, the need for new skills, new professional roles and stronger interprofessional collaboration has never been more urgent. TEAMCARE was created to respond to this challenge by rethinking how professionals are trained to deliver integrated, community-based and person-centred care.

The TEAMCARE Final Conference is more than a closing event: it is a platform for dialogue, mobilisation and future commitment. Bringing together policy makers, education and training providers, healthcare organisations, European networks and innovators, the conference aims to explore how the TEAMCARE model, curriculum and open learning resources can move beyond the project lifecycle and become catalysts for systemic change.

Through its competence framework, European curriculum, micro-credentials, digital learning platform and pilot experiences, TEAMCARE has laid the foundations for a flexible and scalable approach to workforce development. The focus of this conference is therefore on scale-up, adoption and sustainability: how to translate project outcomes into real opportunities for institutions, regions and organisations willing to strengthen community-based interprofessional care.

By fostering exchange, strategic partnerships and new adoption pathways, the conference seeks to contribute to a shared European vision in which education, innovation and collaboration empower professionals to meet the evolving needs of people and communities.
